

GRADE EXPECTATION ADVANCED PLACEMENT CHEMISTRY

Advanced Placement Chemistry is the equivalent of a first-year college Chemistry course. Lecture periods are held daily with lab periods given on alternate days. Additional laboratory activities may be conducted before or after school.

1. **Required Materials:** Notebook, Lab notebook/binder (to be kept in class), Graphing calculator

2. **Grade Determination:**

Exams = 50% Quizzes = 20% Labs = 20% Homework = 10%

3. **FORMAL LABORATORY INVESTIGATIONS**

All formal laboratory investigations will require a formal typed lab report. Lab reports must include a hypothesis, procedure, observations/data, calculations, and a conclusion. Very often students are called upon to make a presentation to the class about their hypotheses, calculations, and conclusions. In this way, students are able to collaborate on the objectives and design of an experiment, to assist each other in reaching conclusions, and to gain insights into variance and sources of error. Graded lab reports will be kept in a designated Laboratory Notebook/Binder. This is a MANDATORY component of the course and will be stored in the classroom. Labs support, convey, and cement the chemical principles presented in lectures and demonstrations. They also provide students with an opportunity to learn new physical skills (such as titration, quantitative transfer, or the use of volumetric equipment), foster good collaborative relationships, and improve problem-solving techniques.

4. **EXTRA HELP**

Extra help is available before, during, and after school. Students are encouraged to meet with me whenever they are concerned with their performance or in regard to the material presented in class.
